## Phone Calls

*“Do your best to maintain the unity of the Spirit by means of the bond of peace.”*  
Ephesians 4:3

It has been a few weeks now since your child has begun the new school year. Your friends and relatives are asking, “How is school going?” Well, that depends, doesn’t it? How is it going for you as a parent or how is it going for your child – or both?

As with most years here at Saint Paul, nearly 50% of our student body will be new students – so whether your child is new or returning, there are a lot of new faces and new names to get used to. This means “change” – changes in class schedules, changes in roommates, and changes in expectations. Not only do the students experience a lot of change, but parents, do too – especially if this is the first time you are separated from your child for a long period of time.

There will be those phone calls from your children that sound fairly desperate. You may be the only one to whom they will unload any and all of their frustrations on and you may hang up and think, “WOW – that was a lot of angst!” You might call the next day asking about those dire circumstances, only to get a confused response. “Oh, that

was yesterday. Today we had chili-dogs for lunch...”

What happened? You happened. You were there to listen to their concerns and

whether you knew it or not, that was good enough. They just needed to unload and you were just the person they chose to unload on. Then they were able to go on with their day, knowing that someone else understood their problems.

When Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus, he knew that there would be both Jews and Gentiles who would come from different backgrounds. They had been brought up differently and there might be frequent causes for confrontation, but Paul shows them that they should “intensely work” to promote and preserve peace and unity. By unity of the Spirit we are to understand not only a spiritual unity, but also a unity of sentiments, desires, and affections, such as is worthy of and springs from the Spirit of God.

This year’s school theme is “All for One,” which implies that unity is more than just getting along in the dorm (even though it includes that). As our students practice this “bond of peace” there may be times when they just have to unload on someone. If that happens to be you, congratulations. You must be a pretty good parent!
